

TOMONA MATSUKAWA

Matsukawa's photorealistic paintings originate from interviews with women of her generation exploring the complexity of intergenerational relationships.

"My work reveals the stories or the problems that these women carry on in life. Through capturing the subtle and fragmented gestures, I am trying to present a bigger picture of society through individual conditions." - Tomona Matsukawa

Tomona Matsukawa was born in Aichi, Japan in 1987. Matsukawa graduated from Tama Art University in 2011, specializing in oil painting. Her recent exhibitions include Roppongi Crossing 2016: My Body, Your Voice (Mori Museum, Tokyo, 2016), Shell Artist Selection (The National Art Center, Tokyo, 2013) and Artist Meets Kurashiki vol.12 Tomona Matsukawa (Ohara Museum of Art, Okayama, 2016). She was a finalist for the Asian Art Award (2017), and was awarded the Fukazawa Ichiro Memorial Award (2011) and the 25th Holbein Scholarship (2010).




WU JIARU

Wu Jiaru grew up in a typical Guangdong city in southern China which was shaped by the entertainment, aesthetic and lifestyle influences entering the mainland through Hong Kong in the 1990s. Jiaru's paintings draw on her own childhood memories while also reflecting the shared fragmented memory of millennials in Southern China.

Wu Jiaru (b.1992) is a Hong Kong based artist who received her dual BA degrees in Fine Arts and English Language from Tsinghua University in 2014, and her MFA from the School of Creative Media at City University of Hong Kong in 2017. Her work is in the collection of M+, Hong Kong. She recently received the New York fellowship grant from the Asian Cultural Council.

MOVANA CHEN

JAKKAI SIRIBUTR


Jakkai is one of the leading Thai artists primarily known for his textile and embroidery works in powerful responses to contemporary and historical societal issues in Thailand.

Jakkai Siributr (b. 1969) lives and works in Thailand. He studied Textile and Fine Arts at Indiana University, Bloomington, USA; and Printed Textile Design, at Philadelphia University, USA. He has exhibited widely, with notable exhibitions including Exploring the Cosmos: The Stupa as a Buddhist Symbol, Asian Civilizations Museum, Singapore (2013); Phantoms of Asia: Contemporary Awakens the Past, Asian Art Museum of San Francisco, California (2012), USA; Link Tradition and Future, (2012); and the 2nd Chongqing Biennale for Young Artists, The Art Museum of Sichuan Fine Art Institute, Chongqing, China (2011). AIDATOMESCU

"In Tomescu's mature paintings the sheer physicality of paint, its density and the archaeology of the layers, its application and movement across the surface, is inseparable from the content. The tenor of the work is guided by its colouration and by its internal rhythms, like the variations and tonalities in music." - Deborah Hart, senior curator at the National Gallery of Australia

Aida Tomescu (b. 1955) born in Bucharest, Romania in 1955, has been living and working in Sydney, Australia since 1980. Tomescu studied at the Institute of Arts, Bucharest, was awarded a Diploma of Visual Arts in 1977, and shortly after her arrival to Australia completed a postgraduate degree at the City Art Institute in 1983. Tomescu has exhibited regularly since 1978 with forty solo shows to date, and has participated in national and international exhibitions and events including Know My Name, National Gallery of Australia (2020-22); Abstraction, National Gallery of Australia touring exhibition, (2017-2018); The Mind's Eye, Art Gallery of South Australia, (2013); Out of Australia: Prints and Drawings, The British Museum, London, (2011); and Contemporary Encounters, Ian Potter Centre: National Gallery of Victoria, (2010). In 2009 a major survey exhibition of Tomescu's works was held at the Drill Hall Gallery, Australian National University, Canberra. Tomescu is represented in all major art museums in Australia and in international collections including the National Gallery of Australia; the National Gallery of Victoria; the Art Gallery of New South Wales; the Art Gallery of South Australia; Queensland Art Gallery; Heide Museum of Modern Art; Auckland Art Gallery, New Zealand; and the British Museum, London, UK.











VICTORIA CANTONS

Cantons presents a record of trauma and healing, alongside a rigorous inquiry into the social constraints surrounding gender politics. Deeply informed by her own experience of limitation and stigma, her work reverberates with notions of freedom, selfhood, representation, power and aspects of the human condition which she writes, despite our divergent identities and experiences, "connect us all."

Victoria Cantons (b. 1969) lives and works in London. She studied Fine Art Painting at Wimbledon College of Arts (UAL); followed by the Painters Studio Programme, Turps Art School, London; and graduated with an MFA in Painting from Slade School of Fine Art, UCL, in 2021, where she received the Felix Slade Scholarship. She was shortlisted for the Chadwell Award in 2021 and for New Contemporaries in 2022. Recent solo exhibitions include People Trust People Who Look Like Them at Flowers Gallery, Kingsland Road, and Champagne Tastes on Beer Money at Guts Gallery, London. Recent group exhibitions include Tomorrow: London, White Cube, (online); the Royal Academy Summer Exhibition, London; and PAPA RAGAZZE, Nicodim Gallery, Los Angeles. Cantons curated the Slade Rooms as part of LONDON GRADS NOW 2020 and 2021 at the Saatchi Gallery, London.
